Fly Tying Saturday, March 2nd, 10a


Come tie flies, talk fishing, and enjoy snacks with us!





Every Wednesday at 10a Storytime is a great place for kids age 2-5 to make friends, learn about books, and spend time engaging their minds with interactive activities.




Kennedy's Kitchen Irish Concert Thursday, March 7th, 7p

Help us kick off the growing season by planting seeds and preparing our raised bed garden spot for transplants.





Feel free to come anytime between 10-11 for the open play aspect, but only registered participants may attend the **demo class** portion.



Three beloved authors share stories of the Alnwick family through the generations, revealing how love and war can change a place—but only its people can unshackle it from the misdeeds of the past.




Insane City by Dave Barry
