
Save the Date(s)

May is "Get Caught Reading" month, where people of all ages are encouraged to incorporate reading into their everyday lives.


Are you reading on the bus? At the table? In the park? In the breakroom? In bed? During May, we'll be giving out books to kids and teens who get 'caught' reading.

In Rocketry 101, students will learn all about what it takes to build a rocket, and how the ND team chooses to execute the process, with a real rocket to examine.




Same Page Book Club Monday, April 1st, 10a




Cinema Showcase Tuesday, April 2nd, 1p




Reading Ready Storytime Every Wednesday in April, 10a



An eight-week series of free music classes for you and your baby, infant to eight months.








Trout Day at Bonneyville Mill Saturday, April 27th, 9:30a


The Book of Hope

by Jane Goodall and Douglas Abrams


Drawing on decades of work that has helped expand our understanding of what it means to be human and what we all need to do to help build a better world, The Book of Hope touches on vital questions, including:

Holding a Tender Heart by Jerry S. Eicher


"This book... reminded me of trading places Amish Style... It was interesting to learn why each daughter wanted to leave their family and join another family."
