
Enter your gingerbread house in this year's contest; drop off your creation December 1st and 2nd!


### Middlebury Food Pantry Angel Tree

There will be a change in how the library notifies patrons of long overdue books! If your items have been overdue for longer than three weeks, you will no longer receive a paper billing notice. Instead, your account will simply be blocked until the items are returned or the replacement cost is paid (this blockage includes the use of Libby and Hoopla).

### *The Year of Magical Thinking*

by Joan Didion

"You can't help but be impacted by this book. It's a personal journey through one of the hardest experiences in life, and it gives voice to the thoughts and feelings of grief. It's a book to expand your reality through someone else's lens. The hardest and most rewarding kind of book."

Several days before Christmas 2003, John Gregory Dunne and Joan Didion saw their only daughter, Quintana Roo, fall ill with septic shock. She was put into an induced coma and placed on life support. Days later, the Dunnes were sitting down to dinner after visiting their daughter in the hospital when John suffered a fatal heart attack. In that one moment, their partnership of forty years came to an end.

This powerful narrative is Didion's "attempt to make sense of the weeks and then months that cut loose any fixed idea I ever had about death,


